

Trump signs order to move controversial oil pipelines forward

U.S. President Donald Trump signed two executive orders on Tuesday to move forward with construction of the controversial Keystone XL and Dakota Access oil pipelines, rolling back key Obama administration environmental actions in favor of expanding energy infrastructure.

While oil producers in Canada and North Dakota are expected to benefit from a quicker route for crude oil to U.S. Gulf Coast refiners, a revival of the projects would mark a bitter defeat for Native American tribes and climate activists, who vowed to fight the decisions through legal action.

Trump campaigned on promises to increase domestic energy production and before taking office indicated he supported completion of the Dakota pipeline and restarting the C\$8 billion (\$6.1 billion) Keystone XL project, which was rejected in 2015 by then-President Barack Obama.

Protesters had rallied for months against plans to route the \$3.8 billion Dakota Access Pipeline beneath a lake near the Standing Rock Sioux reservation, saying it threatened water resources and sacred Native

American sites. It is not yet clear how exactly the orders will move the projects forward.

In a statement, the Standing Rock Sioux said they would fight the decision.

"Americans know this pipeline was unfairly rerouted towards our nation and without our consent. The existing pipeline route risks infringing on our treaty rights, contaminating our water and the water of 17 million Americans downstream," said Dave Archambault II, chairman of the Standing Rock tribe.

The North Dakota Petroleum Council, the trade group for the state's oil producers who are relying on Dakota Access to expand their crude transport options, cheered Trump's order. We think this is a great step forward for energy security in America," said Ron Ness, the council's president.

The more than 800,000 bpd Keystone XL pipeline linking Canada's oil sands to the U.S. Gulf Coast was conceived nearly a decade ago. Since then, however,

the U.S. shale revolution has redefined oil flows, with domestic refiners suddenly finding themselves awash with plentiful supply and needing fewer foreign imports.

Canadian Natural Resources Minister Jim Carr said in Calgary that TransCanada Corp's Keystone XL has all the regulatory approvals it needs in Canada, and that the project would be "very positive for Canada."

Environmental activists broadly opposed the Keystone XL pipeline and campaigned against it for more than seven years, eventually winning a victory when Obama rejected the project in 2015.

"President Trump appears to be ignoring the law, public sentiment and ethical considerations with this executive order aimed at resurrecting the long-rejected Keystone XL pipeline and circumventing the ongoing environmental review process for the highly controversial Dakota Access pipeline," Trip Van Noppen, president of nonprofit environmental law organization Earthjustice said in a statement.

TransCanada shares last traded up 2.6 percent on the Toronto Stock Exchange. The company did not immediately respond to a request for comment on Tuesday.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in January said it would begin an environmental assessment that could delay the Dakota project further. It is not clear if Trump's order supersedes that move, and the Standing Rock statement suggested the order circumvents the environmental review.

In Cannon Ball, North Dakota, protesters, many of whom have stayed at the camp for months, expressed concern about the order but said they would continue fighting to protect the environment.

"I'm staying here. I'm standing with

Transfer Partners' request for an easement to tunnel under the nearby Missouri River.

Most of the 1,172-mile (1,885 km) Dakota pipeline was completed by the summer of 2016, except for a small section under Lake Oahe, a reservoir that forms part of the river. Trump on Monday met with leaders of labor unions, including the Building and Construction trades group and the Laborers

nternational Union of North America, who have been vocal supporters of both pipeline projects. Both groups had endorsed Trump rival Hillary Clinton in the 2016 U.S. election, but disagreed with her opposition to the Keystone pipeline. In a statement on Tuesday, the U.S. Teamsters Union noted that the pipelines would "put thousands of Americans" to work.

Trump, speaking on Tuesday in Washington, said Keystone XL would create 28,000 jobs, but that figure is at odds with a 2014 U.S. State Department environmental study, which said the project would create 3,900 U.S. construction jobs and 35 permanent jobs. Shares of ETP, the company building the 450,000 barrel-a-day Dakota pipeline, were up 3.7 percent in U.S. trading. Trump owned ETP stock through at



USDA Invests \$13.6 Million in Citrus Greening Research

Agriculture's (USDA) National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) today announced four grants totaling more than \$13.6 million to combat a scourge on the nation's citrus industry, citrus greening disease, aka Huanglongbing. The funding is made possible through NIFA's Specialty Crop Research Initiative (SCRI) Citrus Disease Research and Extension Program, authorized by the 2014 Farm Bill.

"The economic impact of citrus greening disease is measured in the billions," said NIFA Director Sonny R a m a s w a m y. "NIFA investments in research are critical measures to help the citrus industry survive and thrive, and to encourage growers to replant with confidence."

Huanglongbing (HLB) is currently the most devastating citrus disease worldwide. HLB was first detected in Florida in 2005 and has since affected all of Florida's citrus-producing areas leading to a 75 percent

Fifteen U.S. States or territories are under full or partial quarantine due to the presence of the Asian citrus psyllid (ACP), a vector for HLB.

The ARS project will identify and assess the effectiveness and economic viability of chemotherapy treatment options.



How many times have vou seen on Face book or other social media sites about someone going on vacation, going to the store or being out of town for some other reason? Majority of us have done this or know someone who has done this. This is just an open invitation for a burglar to go and burglarize your home. Do not post comments about going out of town for the week or even a

night. Do not post photos while on vacation and avoid checking in to places, as this is also a record of when you are not home and gives a burglar time to pay your home an unwanted visit. You will have plenty of time to post your photos when you return from

your trip. Be careful of what you put on these sites and who you share this information with. Addresses and phone numbers could help potential burglars or stalkers locate you much more easily. Identity theft is made simpler by every piece of information the thief can obtain about you. Do not post information that could give crooks

information about your password hints. Some common ones include your mother's maiden name, your pet's name, or the name of the street you grew up on. Do not post pictures of checks, credit cards, account numbers, your bank or credit card companies. Don't make comments on these sites about your finances, even in general. For instance, if you win a thousand dollars at the casino, do not post this on Face book. This could make you a potential target of a burglary or robbery. 

did see a few

By: Gina Stanley signs walking around downtown. I was there with my daughter. Her middle school cheer squad was competing at the National Cheerleader Association (NCA) Nationals. This is the final stop for squads looking for a national title.

You may be rolling your eyes. It's just a bunch of prissy, entitled teen girls running around in short skirts, right? I may have thought that a couple of years ago. But that was before I was informed and knowledgeable about the work that goes into learning a four-minute routine. These girls are athletes in the truest sense of the word, using their physical strength to lift others into the air in various positions. Using their speed and flexibility to tumble, dance, cheer LOUDLY and look pleasant while doing it. At the end of the weekend, our squad finished in 2nd by .07. A heartbreaker. But their coach – and the coach of the winning team - prepared them to be gracious and classy. When our team was announced as runner-up, the winning team knew they had iust been crowned national champs. But they sat quietly while our girls collected their

When the winning team was finally announced, they jumped and screamed in delight as only middle school cheerleaders can. Our girls immediately went to them with hugs of congratulations. That's humility and character.

So that made me think again of the women I'd seen outside the convention center. One carried a poster comparing our President's penis to a pickle. I have no idea what that meant. Others glared at our girls as they walked by. They didn't seem to appreciate their unique contribution to future womanhood. When one girl made a positive comment about Trump in response to their anti-Trump chants, their glare turned into obvious anger.

I've asked friends who supported this march why they did. The responses really depended on the person. One kind-hearted lady, whose political activism has directly coincided with the election of Donald Trump, noted only the positivity at the march she attended. Hymns were sung and artistic posters reflected the notions of love and acceptance. She felt a sense of peace and camaraderie, not divisiveness. Another cited the need for equality for all. She saw this as a chance for women to stand up for women of every race, socio-economic status, or religion. She even noted that they marched for those women who are blind to the fact that they should be marching. That's so generous. Look, I get the need for people to vent. But let's be honest. This is less about securing positive outcomes

"Good job," she said. "We'll see you next year." That's being a strong lady not a nasty woman.

Some grown-ups could learn that lesson.

BioPRYN

BioPRYN is a blood pregnancy test for ruminants, and has specific

appeal for the beef industry because it delivers fast, accurate, safe and economical pregnancy diagnostic results.

The technology works on all ruminants, including cattle, sheep, goats and bison. A specific test using ELISA technology which produces fast results has been developed for use exclusively in cattle. BioPRYN evaluates the blood (more specifically, the serum or plasma) of ruminants for a protein called Pregnancy Specific Protein B (PSPB). PSPB is produced by the placenta, and therefore pregnant




animals will have the protein in their blood. Farm personnel or your


veterinarian can draw blood samples from the tail or jugular vein, which is an easy-to-learn procedure. Blood samples of at least 2ml per animal should be collected in individual vacuum tubes and labeled with each animal's identification number. The tubes can then be boxed and sent to a BioPRYN lab for testing.

Heifers and cows can be

tested at 28 days or later, after breeding. Lactating cows have residual PSPB from previous pregnancy until 78 days after calving. To eliminate the risk of a false-positive result, breeders are cautioned to take the sample at 28 days or more after breeding, and 78 days or more after calving. BioPRYN testing has been shown to have an overall accuracy rate of 97 percent. In fact, the test is 99% accurate in detecting open cows, with only 1% showing false-open (false-negative). Most testing labs have the results ready within twentyfour hours after the samples arrive at the lab. Most BioPRYN testing labs charge from \$2.50 to \$3.00 per sample. Needles and tubes
